



NATIONAL MINE SAFETY WEEK

LV and Mobile Equipment Safety 30 April - 05th May 2023

Description:

THE national mining safety week, which aims to promote safe operations of most mining companies in Papua New Guinea, it originated as an initiative of the chief inspector of mines from the PNG MRA.

"Mining safety week" allows Resource Company Employees to promote safety through participation in activities and information sessions.

Objective:

Plan and coordinate the National Mining Safety Week activities and competitions and ensure there is effective communication throughout the week.

The objective is to engage employees, business partners and the community on proactive safety and to have some fun.

Background:

Ok Tedi's National Mine Safety Week (NMSW) 2023 will focus on "LV and Mobile Equipment Safety" a program was drafted for the OTML operational site and a separate smaller program was developed for the Major Project's business unit.

Why LV and Mobile Equipment Safety

The "LV & Mobile Equipment Safety" theme was selected based on the occurrences of events within the OTML business that involved Fatality, Injuries and equipment damages occurred during 2023.

The Major Projects Department organised varies activities to suit with the NMSW theme. All employees associated with any of the Major Projects sections and work fronts were encouraged to participate with the planned activities to increase the awareness around safe driving so we can influence the trend in reducing Light Vehicle and Mobile Equipment Accidents and Incidents.

Programs and Activities:

The Safety initiatives to celebrate the National Mining Safety Week this year included;

- Prestart check list Competition- LV and a Bobcat
- Equipment Audits
- Emergency Drill- Case Scenario A personal stuck on an EWP

- Crossword Puzzle
- 60 seconds Selfie Video Competition
- Best Photo Competition







Below are the main topics we ran daily with our internal activities that were running in parallel together with these main activities

- Day 2-Intro to light vehicle and Mobile Equipment Safety
- Day 3-At Risk Driving Behaviours
- Day 4-Driver Fitness
- Day 5-Road safety Rules and Public Road Awareness
- Day 6: Vehicle Condition and Systems



Monday 01 of May 2023

The supervisor's from each work ground selected two participants to attend the Prestart check of a Light Vehicle and Mobile Equipment to identify the defects. There were five defects from Light Vehicle and seven defects for Bobcat. Total of 14 employees took part. The prizes were given to people who identify the defects correctly.

Activity# 2: Equipment Audits (Tuesday 02 May 2023)



Activity# 3. Emergency Drill (Wednesday 03 May 2023)

A workplace emergency scenario of a person stuck on an elevated EWP with the ground control not working. Was drafted and agreed upon with key Major Projects and ERT personnel.

The associated information and detail were communicated to key personnel and a brief update of the situation given to the ERT team by area warden.

The event result was the successful retrieval of the stranded employee within the elevated EWP by the Fire Rescue officer elevated on the working EWP and Rescue the injured person to the ground and on to the ambulance vehicle.











Activity 4: Drama (Careless driving through Pedestrian crossing)

A drama was performed by electrical team during the tool box meeting, performing a case scenario of careless driving through pedestrian crossing.

Key Learning: Safe driving habits must not only be practice in the work place but everywhere you go, at home, on break





Sleep monitoring watches (Fitbit's) were supplied to employees that operate LV's within the Major Projects business unit on a regular basis

The aim was to monitor the amount of sleep hours and the readings were recorded from the 3rd-5th May 2023.

A sample of sleep hours recorded by the various employees were;

- 9hrs 25min
- 7hrs 15min
- 6hrs 49min




Activity 6. Crossword Puzzle competition

Only one video was submitted for PAR in Tabubil (Mill).











Activity#8: The Best Photo Competition

During National Mine Safety Week, the Major Projects department encountered two incidents relating to mobile equipment.

Date	Workgroup	Description
04-May-2023	Civil	Excavator became off balance when preparing to move waste material
05-May-2023	Batch Plant	When reversing into location an agitator truck received a damaged mudguard when it came into contact with a RMD shutter.

Closing Remarks

The OTML National Mining Safety Week and in particular within the Major Projects business unit has been a huge success.

Some key areas for improvement identified during the week were;

- Equipment Prestart Complacency
 - Routine task
 - Not completing quality "Pre-start" checks i.e. tick and flick
- Communication
 - Knowing the emergency procedure, channel of communication when working in different areas of the OTML operations
