Introduction

- OK Tedi in collaboration with its Business Partners observed the National Mine Safety Week from the 30th of April 5th of May 2023.
- This event occurred throughout its operational work sites which included the Mine, Mill, Tabubil, Bige, Kuinga and Port Moresby.
- Theme in focus for the National Mine Safety Week for 2023 was on "Light Vehicle and Mobile Equipment Safety".
- The program was held to provide an opportunity to raise awareness and reinforce understanding on the importance of "Light Vehicle and Mobile Equipment Safety" with particular focus on the key controls for this major hazard through targeted programs, activities, and topics of discussion.

- Compliance Blitz was conducted by Asset Protection Department and the local Police through the set-up of roadblocks and spot checks on OTML, Business Partners, Private Vehicles, and buses at Tabubil, Helsinki, Bige and Kiunga.
- Road Safety Awareness was also held in Tabubil and Kiunga for the public motor vehicle and bus drivers. The topics covered in the sessions included general safety rules along the highway and OTML Convoy Procedures.
- Road Transportation Authority (RTA) was engaged and present road safety talk to Port Moresby staff during the safety week.
- Motor Vehicle Insurance Limited (MVIL) team travelled to site and presented on the recent changes to the MVIL regulations to the workforce.

- The Mine Simulator challenge was to reinforce good operating techniques for safe production and was held in a fun controlled environment via the simulator. Close to a 100 people passed through the simulator over the two-day event. The top five winners were identified, announced, and awarded.
- The same concept was also applied with the Light Vehicle Simulator challenge hosted at the Tabubil Training Centre where a total of 29 registered participants (permitted and non-permitted licenced drivers) underwent a 45-minute drive around the "Tabubil Town" in set-up scenario.

- A workplace emergency scenario of an injured person stranded on an elevated work platform (EWP) with the ground control not working
 was put to test by the Major Projects team and ERT personnel.
- The event result was the successful retrieval of the stranded employee within the EWP by the Fire Rescue officer elevated on a secondary EWP and rescuing the injured person by lowering them to the ground and then into the ambulance.
